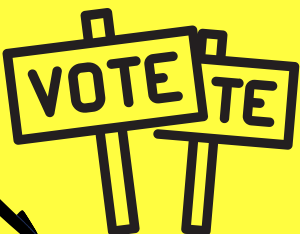


INTERNET SAFETY DAY
