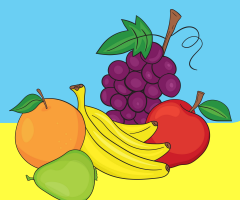

Oak Class have been thinking about population in Geography and why population changes. Discussions have ranged from changes in birth and death rates to the push and pull factors influencing migration and each time pupils have responded in an extremely mature way and shown an impressive understanding of complex issues. We ended the unit with some practical fieldwork in the village, exploring how population impacts the local environment. This included collecting data on traffic and interviewing members of the public to ask for their views.
